Background

Since 2004, the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California grant program has provided \$400,000 to more than 23 college and university teams. The latest round of grant program recipients included a project focused on clean water for a region in El Salvador, a water conveyance and filtration system for a health center and school for the blind in Malawi in southeast Africa, an analysis of local conservation program effectiveness, and development of a modeling tool for urban stormwater resources.

Eligibility

All California colleges are eligible to apply. Teams of undergraduate and graduate students are eligible and can include students from multidisciplinary areas including international relations, urban planning, geography, biology, civil engineering, economics, political science and landscape irrigation science.

Timeline

The grant cycle begins in fall 2015 with a call for applications and culminates in spring 2017 with a project showcase event. Successful grant applicants will be notified in winter 2015 and grant funds dispersed in spring/summer 2016.
