



URGENT PIPELINE RELINING PROJECT

Allen-McColloch Pipeline

The Allen-McColloch Pipeline is a key component of Metropolitan's regional water system, spanning 26 miles to supply treated drinking water to the Municipal Water District of Orange County and its retail agencies. Constructed in the 1970s, portions of the prestressed concrete cylinder pipe need to be relined to ensure future water reliability.

In a recent inspection, Metropolitan identified distressed segments of the pipeline that require urgent repairs. The project will rehabilitate approximately 4,500 feet of pipeline.



WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Construction began in March 2024 and continues through January 2025
- 24-hour work may be necessary
- You may hear noise due to construction, excavation, ventilation and equipment
- You may notice additional construction vehicle traffic in the area
- Your water service will not be disrupted
